### SUCCESS STORY FROM OUR RURAL WATER PUMPS PROJECT

The Rural Water Points Installation Program (RWPIP) one of the MCA-Mozambique Programs funded by MCC is proactive in persuading communities of the benefits of a 50/50 gender balance in Water and Sanitation Committees (WSC), to help ensure that women participate with men, in the decision making over resources, and to minimize management committees being dominated and controlled by men and use the skills obtained to improve their lives.

dirty, causing cholera and other water-bourne related disease. The program also promoted hygiene and Sanitation resulting in latrine construction, improved hygiene and sanitation practice, such as correct hand washing, safe human excreta disposal, safe solid wastes disposal and safe wastewater disposal and drainage.



With the new WP, equipped with a hand pump, she spends less than 20 minutes to get 20 litres bucket of safe drinking water and she can do it Five to Six times a day. "We can wash our families clothes and can have a bath everyday which is good for our health, we can also wash our hands after using the latrine" Anica Amisse, said. But above all she is now building an improved house made of mud, cement and zinc. Mud is the main component used for construction and water is the main requirement".

*"I feel proud of being a member of WSC, because of my work in it I am contributing to improving people's living conditions of the entire Maungaza Community"- Mrs Anica Amisse*

Anica Amisse said " I took advantage of having access to water closer to our house, by improving our home , I am protecting my family from adverse weather conditions, help fighting mosquitoes causing malaria and providing enough and comfortable space for living. It could be difficult to do it without that WP as with it, water became available in good quantity and much closer".

The Program, which is being implemented in the provinces of Cabo Delgado and Nampula in Northern Mozambique has already installed 150 Water Points out of the planned 600 and as part of these, other 250 are being constructed.



Anica Amisse is one of the RWPIP's beneficiaries of the Water Point (WP) installed in the Community of Muangaza, District of Palma, Cabo Delgado Province. She is one of the Community's WSC Member trained by the program and she feels proud of being part of it. Before this WP was installed, Anica Amisse and her neighbors used to fetch water from a traditional well, which is situated 900 meters distance from her house. That well used to be very crowded with limited water, particularly in dry season, usually taking two to three hours to get a 20 litres bucket of water. In raining seasons the water there used to be

## SUCCESS STORIES FROM THE LAND TENURE SERVICE PROJECT

One of the fundamental objectives is to achieve gender balance in all stages of project implementation, which has materialized in a high proportion of women in iTC activities being recorded in the past 2 years of project implementation.

We have interviewed Mrs Jota Aide whom is the president of the Lussanhando Natural Resource Management Committee (NRMC) in Lichinga in the Niassa province was one of the individuals assisted through iTC activities. (ITC stands for the Community Land Initiative)

In describing her experience as the President of the Lussanhando NRMC, she stated:

*"I am happy with my position because I do consultation before taking any decision where men and women provide their opinions; but I make the final decision and all respect that decision. Socially, my husband supports my position in the NRMC and when I am busy he does some home tasks".*

Similar examples are being found more frequently in Natural Resource Management Committee assisted by iTC, along with other iTC activities, as a result of a deliberate effort to integrate gender sensitivity in all iTC activities as part of the implementation of the iTC Gender and Diversity Strategy.


Another example with the positive impact of de-annexation of 100 hectares of land in Macuse supported by iTC is confirmed by Mrs Ermelinda António, a member of APRODAM Association in the following testimonial: *"Before the iTC intervention there was a big conflict between Madal, the owner of the land, and communities.*

*With the iTC intervention I have learned about Land Law, learned that the land had been returned to the Government and that iTC would formalize community land rights. At same time we learned the importance of obtaining land use title to avoid conflicts. After iTC assistance my husband and I are now paying for the education of our 2 sons as a result of production of sesame in a plot formalized by iTC. In the same plot we planted coconut trees received from the Farmer Income*

*support project".*

Gender balance is an important aspect with these approaches been include with use of participatory methods and techniques that include:

- Meeting with women groups;
- Involving women in facilitation processes and in iTC dissemination activities;
- Use of local theatre groups performing the role of women in sustainable management of Natural Resource, and
- Land use and sensitization campaigns to encourage women participate in delimitation and demarcation.

## SUCCESS STORY OF OTÍLIA CARLOS VITORINO, received her DUAT that resulted from the Land Tenure project in Zambezia

Success story of Otília Carlos Vitorino, received her DUAT that resulted from the Land Tenure project of MCA Mozambique in Zambezia from Muanamambene neighborhood, Nicoadala District in Zambezia province in June 2012. Otília Carlos Vitorino is married, mother of three children, living in the Muanamambene neighborhood. She re-



ceived 5 DUAT titles for her plots of land that she inherited from her mother. "I am the only daughter who lives here in Nicoadala, my brothers and sisters are married and live outside the District. It was the family decision for me to register the land in my name because that is how my mother had distributed the land when she was still alive. I want to thank you very much for the initiative. I could not dream of registering these lands, because I'm a woman who depends on what I produce at the farm. I had no information that I could register my plots neither did I have any money for the documents. I am very happy with the project; MCA Mozambique and the Government helped us a lot. My Children and I are safe and well protected now"

The Land Tenure Project has remarkably issued and delivered to urban beneficiaries a total of 39 930 land titles. Of these, 14 853 are owned by female land holders. In addition to the Land Tenure Regularisation, the project trained this quarter 15 more paralegals in Cabo Delgado province, which brings the total to date to 288, of whom 56 are women, in all four provinces of project intervention.

On Land Tenure Regularisation, MCA has handed over 37 554 urban land titles (DUATs) and 2376 rural titles. The project in the last 4 months also trained of 15 freshly graduated Paralegals, six (6) of whom are female, in Cabo Delgado province. This number adds up to 288 paralegals trained under the MCA's Land Tenure Project in the four Northern provinces. Another achievement in the project's Land Administration Capacity Building activities was the return to the country of one of the INFATEC lecturers who had been undergoing further training in Brazil on a scholarship provided by MCA. It is expected that his newly acquired skills will be an added value to INFATEC's training activities.

## DELIMITATION OF COMMUNITY LANDS IS HELPING THE DEVELOPMENT OF SMALL BUSINESS AND INCOME GENERATION

A considerable number of communities in rural areas do not have their land demarcated and registered properly. As a result of this factor, many communities see their resources being usurped and exploited by outsiders such as: Poachers and illegal loggers.

As part of the MCA Mozambique implementing the Community Land Initiative (ITC), 5 communities in Sanga district, Niassa province received training on land law, land and natural resources management and community land delimitation. These communities now have an agenda for community use and benefitting from their natural resources, an unofficial certificate that defines the boundaries of their land and Management Committees of Natural Resources (CGRN) formed. In addition, community members were trained in the field of land law, sustainable management of natural resources, financial management and eco tourism.

The project has opened real opportunities for women to participate actively in community life through participation in natural resource management, participation in management Natural Resources committees, which is contributing to improve the families income. The community of Nova Madeira is one of five communities that benefited from the interventions MCA - Mozambique, through the initiative of community land. The community of Nova Madeira and the others in the District of Sanga, are located in an area that has wonderful natural resources (Flora, Fauna and minerals).

Chafar Aide, born and resident in the community of Nova Madeira, is member of the Management Committee of Natural Resources (CGRN), 76 years old, married, father of 8 children which 5 are women, speaks to us about the benefits that his community has had with the intervention of MCA - Mozambique.

*"Our land was inhabited by wild animals, which then began to decline due to poaching practiced by neighboring communities and other stakeholders.*

*Around 1999 to 2001 the government created the PCC - Working Capital Program for the Community of Chipange Chetu in order to teach communities to value and take care of their land. With the creation of this program, appeared some op-*

*erators with whom we started working with. The Community created very high expectations in its relationship with tour operators in the area. There was a problem with communication and promises that were made and never kept and disorganization of the community, the projects have not progressed. The community did not benefit from the 20% of revenues from the exploitation of natural resources paid by different operator because the signed contract for exploitation of natural resources was between the company and the Government without involving the communities".*

*He then further stated "In 2010, through the ITC and Concern Universal, we learned that the MCA-Mozambique would support communities to demarcate their lands. Due to this support of the MCA Mozambique, now we all know what the limits of the community of Nova Madeira are. We also feel those local operators, already conversing with the community are helping us to solve some other problems, such as the balance between humans and Wild Life, they are creating jobs for our young boys and girls".*

The program also helped the CGRN Nova Madeira to open a bank account and they received 19700.00 Mts = USD 700 (nineteen thousand seven hundred meticaís) income from tourism operators.

*Our CGRN comprises 16 members of which four are women. "Now I am happy because we have already defined our community, but we would also like to do more things, personally I would like to see if I could produce honey."*





## Mitigating the impact of HIV and AIDS on infrastructure projects

MCA Mozambique as part of the HIV strategy for the Infrastructure projects has a service provider, N'weti that carries out various projects such as workshops that focus on Alcohol and Drug Abuse, Gender-based violence vs. HIV. Printing and distribution of 150 000 magazines that are written in local languages and Portuguese (50% in Emakua and other 50% in Portuguese) such as (i) "Amor Sexo e Muito Papo", (ii) "Amores a Mais é demais", (iii) "HIV e SIDA: Cuidados Básicos"; (iv) "HIV e SIDA: Saiba Mais, Viva Mais". They further have HIV Testing and have organised very informative Theatre shows at the MCA project sites that transmit a powerful message in a unique and artistic way. During one of the Roadshow's Ms. Filomena Salvador Lamina was interviewed, she is a 25 years old female whom enjoyed the Rio Mecutuchi/Rio Lurio Road show and stated:

1. What do you think of the road show that is about to end?	I enjoyed very much. They should do it every Saturday because we need this kind of things here in Namapa.
2. What were the activities that you found interesting and enjoyed the most?	Many good things were shown. I enjoyed the cultural dances and watching Nacala's musicians dancing. I also enjoyed watching and listening to the HIV positive ladies talking about their lives, I don't know if one day i become HIV-positive i would have the courage to talk to people about my condition.
3. What kind of improvements would you like to see on the next roadshow in September?	I would like the road shows to start earlier, or to end late because it is something that entertains us while we learn. I think that the duration of the road show should be longer.

Mr Alberto Amade Gabriel, a 27 year old male was interviewed at the Nampula water supply project and had the following to state:

1. What do you think of the road show that is about to end?	The show was pretty good, I enjoyed watching it.
2. What were the activities that you found interesting and enjoyed the most?	Almost all the activities were interesting but I mostly liked the musicians and the video about the HIV-positive couple, that instead of arguing over who brought the disease home, they tried to live happily and in harmony. It was very nice to have a site setup for HIV/AIDS testing. I took the test for the first time, and thank god the result was negative, which means that from now on I should behave and be more careful not to get infected.
3. What kind of improvements would you like to see on the next roadshow in September?	the show should not last only a day, but at least two days on weekends. In this way we would learn the messages faster.






