

**1999**

**Victoria Falls,**

Became the first location for Rani Resorts investment in Southern Africa. The Stanley and Livingstone Reserves, and the Victoria Falls National Park, are located on the border between Zimbabwe and Zambia.

**2006**

The intimate **Lugenda Wilderness Camp** set in Mozambique's remote Niassa Game Reserve, opens to discerning travelers wishing to explore one of the last of Africa's wild and untamed locations.

**1999**

Wanting to combine the sun and beach, Rani Resorts established a diving lodge set on Mozambique's Bazaruto Island which is part of the Bay Island Resort. Later additions include the Bazaruto Bay Island Resort. Later additions include the Bazaruto Bay Island Resort.

**2012**

Rani Investments buys the Horizon Project in Maputo, comprising of **Radisson Hotel** and adjacent serviced Apartments and Office Towers.

**2002**

The iconic North African styled **Banka Banka Hotel** is opened in Pemba.

**2004**

The remote island of Matemo, in the Quirimbas Archipelago sees the opening of its **24 chalet unit, Matemo Island**, a spicy and culturally rich addition to Rani Resorts portfolio

**2005**

Rani Resorts establishes the **ultimate island retreat, Medjumbe Private Island**, a 12 Chalet exclusive and tropical idyll, also in the breathtaking Quirimbas Archipelago.

# Community Center

- ❑ Creation of Bazaruto's Community Association Tumba Yedo.
- ❑ Construction of multi purpose community center to serve as a gathering and information center for surrounding villages.
- ❑ Center equipped with solar energy panels, borehole and water pump.
- ❑ Association is responsible to scrutinize and manage community issues
- ❑ Manage and channel amounts charged from Park fees




# Community Health Clinic



- ❑ Construction of a health clinic and subsequently maternity ward.
- ❑ Presently in process of restructuring and rehabilitation.
- ❑ Clinic being run by the District Health Directorate.
- ❑ RANI supports clinic with medical supplies.
- ❑ Construction of accommodation quarters for nurses

# Education



- ❑ Supply blackboards.
- ❑ Water pumps and boreholes
- ❑ Construction of buildings with 2 classrooms each in Indigo Bay and Matemo
- ❑ Yearly payment of students school registration fees

# Water & Sanitation



- ❑ Research of adequate areas for borehole drilling (Islands and Mainland)



- ❑ Rehabilitation of various existing wells and pumps.
- ❑ In certain cases organized supply of water by the hotel unit (desalinized water) to the communities is arranged.

# Agricultural Micro Projects

## Vegetable Garden

- ❑ All our projects are coordinated with the Park Authorities to ensure adherence to Management Plan. Disseminate vegetable seeds and help community to plant seedlings out in 2 areas.
- ❑ 2 co-ops oversee the plants and sell to units once vegetables are ready.
- ❑ Some seeds are harvested from plants for next season's production.



# Agricultural Micro Projects



## Avocado Trees

- ❑ Propagate seeds on-site and plant seedlings when ready.
- ❑ Trees are planted randomly in various communities close to the Hotel (PBH - mainland)
- ❑ Distribution Centre in Pemba to buy avocados when trees produce.

# Agricultural Micro Projects

## Salad vegetables

- ❑ Program with Aga Khan Foundation for seeds and plant when ready.
- ❑ Plant in dedicated areas as per management plan in Quirimbas



All greening projects to be initiated for other communities once Matemo is established.

Other communities do visit Matemo area and get first-hand information to enable them to do same.



# Agricultural Micro Projects



- ❑ The old Management plan in Bazaruto is not clear in defining micro agricultural areas to implement sustainable means of agricultural projects.



- ❑ Proposed new area surrounding community center.

# Chicken & Egg Production

- ❑ Egg Production - 200 chickens.
- ❑ Established chicken roaming areas within specific boundaries.
- ❑ Started with egg production.



## Fish purchase

All fish, within authorized sizes, are bought from island communities, mostly also for bait

# Handcrafts

- ❑ Joint program with Aga Khan Foundation where staff teach communities to make handcrafts.
- ❑ These crafts are sold in Hotels' Curio shops or given to guests upon turndown.
- ❑ Other crafts are sourced from local communities, e.g. Dhow models, Kapulana Clothing, Face Paint (Mussiuro), etc.
- ❑ With park restrictions, research is being done on how to maximize available materials to make handcrafts and sell directly from artisans to tourists during cultural tours into rural communities.



# Conservation



- ❑ Logistical support and facilitation for various NGOs and Government Agencies in helping to create awareness of environmental and conservation issues as well as help Park Authorities in ensuring conformity to Park regulations.

# Marine Conservation

RANI has provided National Parks with support in logistics, namely:

- ❑ Illegal fishing practices, both industrial and small scale finishing.
- ❑ Supply of patrol boat for Quirimbas National Park.
- ❑ Dissuasion of fishermen from trek netting in surrounding areas
- ❑ Promoting protection of coral reefs in surrounding areas
- ❑ Creation of special sanctuary areas in non park locations (Medjumbe)



## Direct Financial Gains

- ❑ These funds are destined for conservation of infrastructures and maintenance of further equipment, such as water pumps, solar energy, etc.
- ❑ “Dollar a Guest” Program: For each dollar donated by guests, RANI will match.
- ❑ 20% of Park taxes (10\$/per pax) are passed to the Communities/Association on a yearly basis.
- ❑ Others : Medical assistance to especially disadvantaged children requiring specific treatment and other non routine events are funded throughout the year.
